

## COMMISSION HEARING

## IN THE MATTER OF THE RACING COMMISSION ACT S.O. 2000, c.20;

## AND IN THE MATTER OF THE APPEAL AND REQUEST FOR HEARING BY STANDARDBRED LICENSEE RENE ALLARD

On March 15, 2011, standardbred trainer Rene Allard, ("ALLARD") (ORC Licence Y8319), appealed Judges' Ruling SB43193, dated March 5, 2011, wherein he was fined \$200 for being late to the paddock with the horse Home Run Hitter for race 9 at Flamboro Downs on March 5, 2011, in violation of Rule 26.12 of the Rules of Standardbred Racing.

On May 5, 2011, a Panel of the Ontario Racing Commission ("ORC") consisting of Chair Rod Seiling, convened to hear the appeal.

Rick Rier appeared as agent for the Administration. ALLARD attended the hearing in person and was unrepresented.

Upon hearing the testimony of Judge John Dorion, upon reviewing the exhibits filed and upon hearing the submissions of Rier and Allard, the Panel dismissed the appeal.

A transcript of the Panel's Oral Decision is attached to this Ruling.
